Mayor Jacobs' Small Business Series Features Vida / The Vault

KNOXVILLE, *Tenn*.— Knox County Mayor Glenn Jacobs interviews Jim Klonaris, owner of Vida/The Vault, as part of his small business series.

"There's a lot of fear downtown," said Klonaris. "It affected us on the employer side. We were able to sustain and provide the right service and we've somehow, by the grace of God, made it all the way through."

The Mayor asked Klonaris to walk him through his creative process from conception to execution.

"I went to school as an architect and interior designer," said Klonars. "Even though I never went into my field, it's my creative field, it's really my passion. My wife, Lori, she's a chef. She has this pallet that meets people where they need to be food wise. It is really a partnership."
