Officials will hold two public information meetings this month to seek community input on the East Knox Mobility Study. The meetings will help identify key transportation challenges, set priorities, and shape the final recommendations for the study.

Veterans Day falls on November 11th and, as always, will include Knoxville Veteran's Day Parade which starts at 10:40 and travels along Gay Street.
