

PURPOSE

Knox County Grants and Community Development (KCGCD) is pleased to announce the Fiscal Year 2026 through Fiscal Year 2028 grant application for the Defined Service Program.

Funding for this program is provided by Knox County's General Fund and Hotel/Motel Tax Fund. The purpose of the grant is to allocate County funds in a responsible and effective manner to support nonprofit programs within our community. These programs should be efficient, well-managed, and accountable, ensuring they represent a prudent investment of taxpayer dollars.

Knox County seeks to address the needs of County residents and invest in opportunities that allow them to thrive in an engaged and vibrant community. A Defined Service refers to a program or service offered to residents that the Knox County Government would otherwise need to provide if the program did not exist.

PROGRAM PERIOD

The program period will be July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2028. Contracts will initially be for Fiscal Year 2026, with the option to renew for two additional years, pending budget approval from Knox County Commission. Extensions will occur one year at a time for a total of three years.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

The County expects to fund multiple projects and asks that applicants consider this while developing their funding request. Funding requested in the application should be for one year. In Fiscal Year 2025, Knox County allocated \$1,823,250 in Defined Service Program funds to non-profit organizations.

Funding will be provided only as reimbursements and is dependent on meeting all reporting requirements. If Knox County does not allocate funds to the awarded agency in any fiscal year, or if there aren't enough funds, the Defined Service Program contract will end once the previously allocated funds are expended or at the end of the current fiscal year, whichever happens first. In such cases, neither party will have any further obligations to each other.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

ORGANIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Knox County is seeking applications from experienced organizations actively engaged in addressing community needs. Eligibility requirements include:

- 1. The organization must be located within and serving residents of Knox County.
- 2. The organization must have a Unique Entity ID (UEI) and be registered within the Federal System for Award Management (SAM) database at https://sam.gov.
- 3. The organization must be an incorporated non-profit entity registered with the TN Secretary of State and listed as "Active" at https://tnbear.tn.gov/Ecommerce/FilingSearch.aspx.

Applications are submitted online through the Neighborly software portal utilized by KCGCD for subrecipient and contract management. Applicants may access the KCGCD grants management website at https://knoxcounty.org/communitydevelopment/ or https://portal.neighborlysoftware.com/knoxcountytn/participant#.

Existing subrecipients may log in using their current credentials. New applicants must register for the portal. Neighborly registration information is included at the end of this notification.

APPLICATION WORKSHOP

The workshop will go over accessing the Neighborly system, eligibility, and funding priorities. There will also be time for potential applicants to ask any questions they may have. SELECTION PROCESS

Application Screening: KCGCD will screen all applications to ensure that they meet the requirements included in the funding announcement.

Application Review: A curated panel will review applications to understand the overall demand and effectiveness of the program, utilizing the scoring rubrics included in this notification.

Final Decisions: KCGCD will consider rankings along with other factors to make final funding decisions. Other factors may include cost effectiveness, overall funds availability, county government priorities and strategies, federal or state regulations, community need, geographic distribution, balance of focuses and approaches, or other relevant factors. KCGCD may not fund all applications or may only award a portion of the amount requested. If funding requests exceed available funds, KCGCD may ask applicants to revise projects to a more limited focus.

Final Knox County Approval: Approval of any funding provided through Knox County is ultimately the decision of the County Mayor, with final approval provided by Knox County Commission.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS


Those selected for funding will be required to complete quarterly reports and reimbursement requests through KCGCD's online grant reporting system, Neighborly. Goals and performance indicators will be set for each contracted program.






CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

When you access the Portal for the first time, you'll need to sign up for an account by clicking on the *Sign up now* link. The registration process will create a username (which is your work email address) and password that will be used for future logins. The email address you choose will also be used for system emails/notifications. For security purposes, the system will validate that you own the registered email address by sending an email with a validation link.

Note: If you do not receive the system email within 2 minutes, check your spam or bulk mail folder. If the email appears in that folder, you should right click on the email to indicate "Not Junk" or "Not Spam" to ensure you receive any other system notifications.
