## Medicare Open Enrollment 2025

Medicare Open Enrollment season runs October 15th thru December 7th. Open Enrollment is the time when Medicare beneficiaries can make changes to their plans, especially when it comes to Part D—Prescription Drug Plans. It is important to review your part D coverage every year because premiums, co-payments and the drugs covered can change from year-to-year, even within the same plan. Also, a change in the medication you're taking can affect if a plan is right for you.

Approximately a 2 miles walk on flat ground.




